Thank you again for your generosity, your time, and your enduring friendship. We look forward to seeing you on the Mansion grounds again next year!

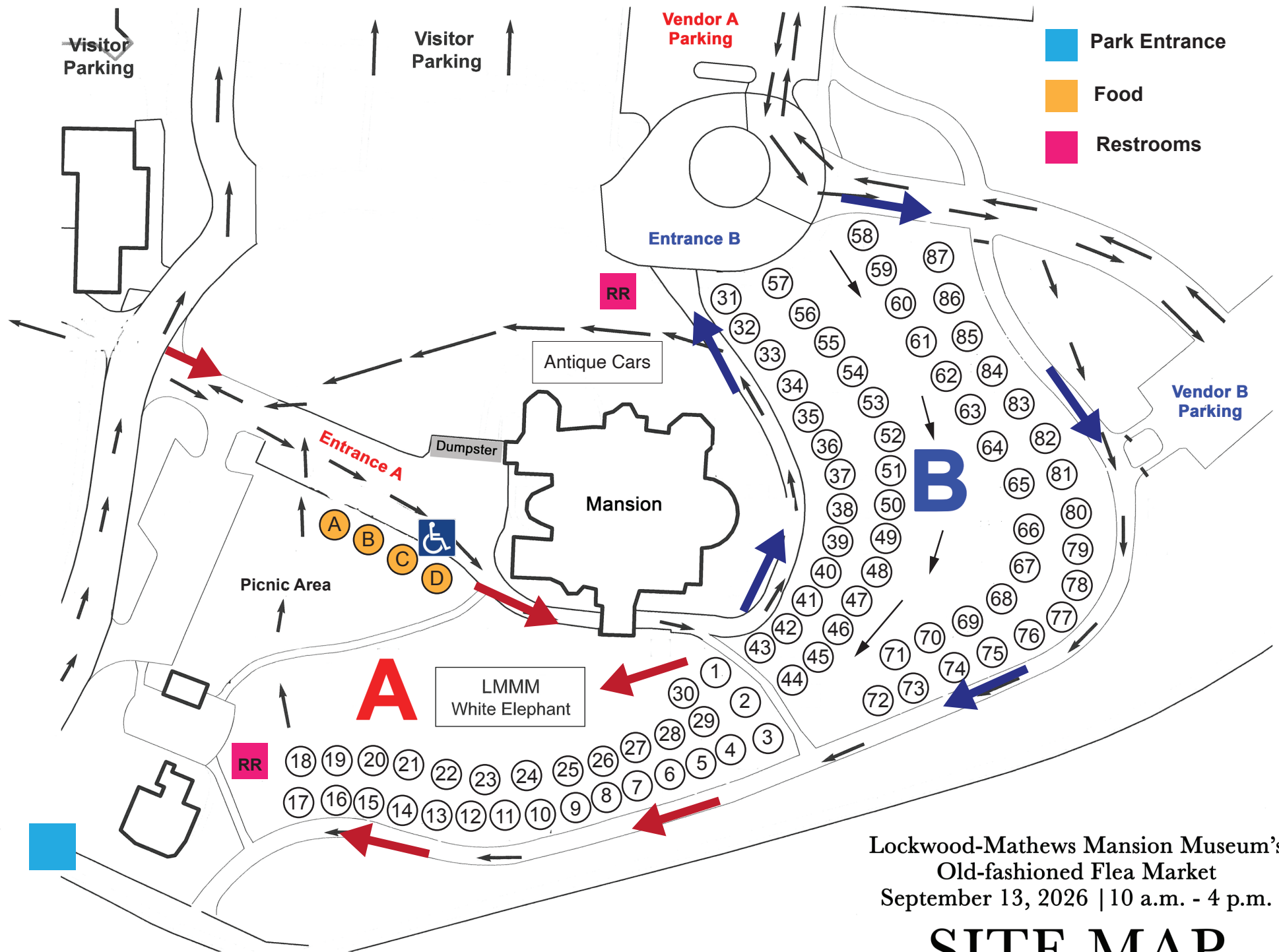
